

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EXHIBITOR'S RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Entries will be accepted between 2pm and 9pm on Wednesday of fair week.
- 2. The entry fee is \$5 per adult exhibitor and \$1 per child.
- 3. All entries must be listed on the printed forms provided in the center of this manual. If form is missing or if additional forms are needed, they can be picked up at the library, the local pharmacy, online, the Taymouth Community Center and at the Hillside Convenience Store. These forms must be filled in and signed by the exhibitor and must accompany entries.
- 4. The exhibitor must have personally produced the item(s) to be entered.
- 5. Every item must have a tag attached with the section, class and exhibitor's number clearly displayed. These tags are provided when entries are accepted.
- 6. No article may be entered in more than one section, and only one article will be accepted per class.
- 7. Judging will be completed by 6pm Thursday of fair week.
- 8. Exhibitors are not allowed to remove or adjust exhibits once they are placed in position, unless given permission by fair personnel.
- 9. Any exhibitor wishing to sell any article may attach a price tag.
- 10. All exhibits EXCEPT livestock must stay on the grounds until Monday unless removal is pre-authorized. Exhibits are to be picked up Monday between 2pm and 8pm.

Safety of Exhibits

Although the Agricultural Society will take all reasonable precautions to ensure the safety and security of articles exhibited, it must be understood that the owners/exhibitors will assume all risk. Should any item be stolen, damaged or lost the Agricultural Society will strive to recover the item. However, no payment will be made for its replacement.

Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion or other exhibits that could cause injury or damage to persons coming in contact with them will guard their exhibit and protect the public from injury. The Society will not be responsible for any claims, demands, costs, charges and/or expenses resulting from such an occurrence.

Table or booth rental space is available for anyone interested. All charges or rental fees must be paid at the opening of the exhibition.

<u>Quality</u>: Yolk outlining indistinct, yolk round in shape and reasonably cantered, showing no germ development or readily visible defects.

Shell: Shell should not be broken or cracked and should be normal in shape. Slightly rigid or rough areas or slightly misshapen shells are permitted. The shell must be clean.

<u>Weight:</u> Grade A should weigh a minimum of 24 ounces per dozen. Grade A small size should weigh a minimum of 18 ounces per dozen.
