"Step Back In Time" in celebration of Canada 150 we are presenting and extensive historical display inside the Agrena ~ "Exhibit Hall". The antique truck, tractor, farm equipment and small engine display will be bigger and better. That exhibit will be joined by two new exhibits.

- ~ A World War I display that will showcase information, stories and photos on many of the 120 young men and 3 women from the Stanley area who are named on the Stanley cenotaph, and on the Honour Rolls at local churches, as well as some from the Nashwaak Bridge and the Tay Creek areas. The Legion is lending items from their collection. This small community made a huge contribution to the war, and 22 young men died in battle. Drop by and find out your connection to these brave men and women.
- $^{\sim}$ Using artefacts on loan from the Fredericton Museum two rooms will be set-up re-creating a kitchen and parlour circa 1860. This will be the farm kitchen of Mrs. Jane Taylor, famous farm woman. Jane Taylor, a widow, emigrated to Stanley where her parents John and Isabel Douglass had immigrated years before.
